Charlottesville, April 4, 2013 – Charlottesville and Albemarle County will feature a great selection of local festivals in the upcoming weeks. These festivals will celebrate everything from innovation and wine to flowers, creatures and steeple chase races. Here are some of these events not to be missed.

The **Dogwood Festival** celebrates the arrival of spring in a big way, **April 4 through the 21**. Featuring an array of events such as a pageant, parade, concert and a long-awaited carnival, this Festival is named in honor of the official flower of the state of Virginia. Coming back with a bang for a second year with a revamped, condensed event with 96 hours of catalyzing innovation converging music, art, design and technology, the **Tom Tom Founders Festival** invites everyone to join in this unique happening from **April 11 through the 14**. Tom Tom will transform historic downtown Charlottesville with four days of public talks, concerts, events and creative energy. The second edition of the **Taste of Monticello Wine Trail** festival will take place on Saturday, **April 13** at the nTelos Wireless Pavilion, in the heart of Downtown Charlottesville. Featuring over 25 local wineries, this event gives visitors the opportunity to taste a vast variety of local

The Creatures are coming... and they will astound you! **The Stan Winston Arts Festival of the Moving Creature**, held on Saturday, **April 20**, will feature Creatures built by University of Virginia students from Architecture, Studio Art, and Drama. These students were involved in a yearlong collaborative workshop to research, to design, and to construct creatures, led by master creature builders from the Stan Winston Studios, who gave birth to some of the most famous creatures ever for the Alien, Jurassic Park, Terminator and Iron Man motion pictures, to only name a few. The Creatures will be joined by other performing artists for an experience like no other. Admission is free.
