Kendall-Jackson and Williams-Sonoma Join Forces to Fight Hunger at 20th Anniversary Heirloom Tomato Festival

Santa Rosa, Calif. (Aug. 23, 2016) – This September, Sonoma-based Kendall-Jackson will hit a milestone, opening its doors for the 20th Annual Kendall-Jackson Heirloom Tomato Festival. One of Sonoma County Wine Country's most anticipated events, the festival showcases the area's seasonal bounty. To commemorate this special anniversary, Kendall-Jackson has joined forces with another Sonoma-grown company, Williams-Sonoma, to curate a weekend of tomato-inspired festivities, including a Farm-to-Table Charity Dinner and Silent Auction. Proceeds will benefit charities that fight hunger in the Bay Area – the **Redwood Empire Food Bank** and **No Kid Hungry**®.

The celebration begins on Friday, Sept. 23 with a Farm-to-Table Charity Dinner & Silent Auction set in the winery's Estate Gardens. Each course of the innovative meal will be prepared by a different celebrity chef team, including Top Chef Masters Douglas Keane & Sang Yoon, Top Chef Contestants Brooke Williamson & Casey Thompson, and Williams-Sonoma Chef Partners Joshua McFadden & Ryan Pollnow, who will work with K-J Executive Chef Justin Wangler and Culinary Gardener Tucker Taylor to develop the menu. Guests will dine "al fresco" at a long shared table, under the Sonoma County stars.

Visitors to the Kendall-Jackson Heirloom Tomato Festival on Saturday, Sept. 24 will receive all-day access to an unforgettable lineup of attractions, including samplings of more than 150 heritage varieties of tomatoes grown in Kendall-Jackson's Estate Culinary Gardens, tomato-inspired bites from more than 40 local restaurants, exceptional wines, dynamic seminars led by Master Sommeliers and wine educators, art displays, garden tours, and live entertainment.

The ever-popular Chef Challenge will be back, presented by Williams-Sonoma. Each of the four celebrity chef teams, who also created the signature Farm-to-Table dinner, will compete to create the most delicious tomato-based dishes, featuring heirloom tomato varieties and a basket of mystery ingredients.

In addition to exceptional wine and food offerings, festival guests can discover Kendall-Jackson's Estate Culinary Gardens. Accompanied by members of the UC Master Gardener Program of Sonoma County, Kendall Jackson's own Culinary Gardener, Tucker Taylor, will lead educational tours throughout the day, highlighting the garden's wide variety of specialty produce, beautiful design, and thoughtful stewardship of the land.

This year's festival benefits the Redwood Empire Food Bank, which has provided food assistance in Sonoma County since 1987, focusing on the unmet needs of low-income children, seniors and working families. The Farm-to-Table Charity Dinner and Silent Auction will benefit No Kid Hungry, which is helping children across the country get the food they need and assisting parents in stretching their grocery budgets.

General admission tickets for the Heirloom Tomato Festival are \$95 per person, or \$175 per person for Premier Access, which allows access to the private Premier Tent and Lounge valet parking, barrel samples, limited release wines, and exclusive culinary creations. Kendall-Jackson wine club members on either package. Tickets to the Farm-to-Table Charity Dinner & Silent Auction are \$225 per person.
