The city of Sundbyberg scouts city development trends internationally and organizes a workshop with young people in Berlin to develop innovative ideas about the creative and flexible future work.

The concept is called Ideathon and will gather young people with different backgrounds, to meet and develop innovative ideas for tomorrow's urban environment. The Ideathon under the slogan "Hack the city" will be held on Saturday May 16 in Berlin between 13.00 and 21.00 pm. The aim is to take advantage of young people's ideas about the creative and flexible future work in Sundbyberg.

The railway tracks going through Sundbyberg will be relocated into a tunnel and the entire 30,000 sqm of land released will enable the development to unify the city with buildings and open spaces. The city of Sundbyberg want to create a sustainable city and an important part is how the future workplaces shall be designed. The ideathon take its starting point in several different questions: What is the future of work and what does work look like in 2030? Will there be a need for physical office spaces in the future or do people work in a more flexible way? What are you working with and what is your day like? How is the transformation affecting the city life and what attracts creative people of tomorrow to the city of Sundbyberg?
