It's a super Saturday for Osian in Portugal

Welsh rally star Osian Pryce holds a comfortable second place after day two of Rally of Portugal, the opening round of the World Rally Championship's Drive DMACK Fiesta Trophy.

Pryce was on stunning form through the toughest day of the rally, setting fastest times on half of the day's stages to strengthen his grip on second place.

With more than 100 competitive miles in two loops of three stages, Osian and co-driver Dale Furniss were mindful of the rough nature of the roads – particularly on the second loop – but at the same time, they were keen to bag bonus points on offer for the fastest times. Their most impressive performance came on the foggy second run at the Marão test.

With one day and four stages remaining, Osian's almost two minutes ahead of third-placed Max Vatanen.

"It's been another very good day for us," said Pryce. "The car has been faultless. The only issue today was on the second stage, where I felt we were overdriving a little bit. The car was sliding too much and that cost us some time.

"It's really hard on these roads to find a rhythm, they are twisting and turning all the time. And the fog on the middle stage of the afternoon loop was just unbelievable. You often hear drivers saying these are the worst conditions they've ever driven in, but I'll be honest: that stage was the worst fog I've ever seen. And seeing was the issue; at times I genuinely couldn't see past the end of the bonnet. That was a stage where the pacenotes Dale and I had made worked really well. The risk though was with the rocks, we were trying to avoid them, but in SS14 we couldn't even see them!

"So far, everything is working. Tomorrow, it's more of the same – all eyes on the finish, but if there's any chance of a few more bonus points then we'll give it a go.

"Tomorrow's stages are some of the best and nicest to drive. And, of course, they include the world famous Fafe stage with the huge jump. For as long as I can remember, I've known about this jump — watching videos of Group B cars coming over there and then drivers like Colin McRae. It's kind of one of those pinch-yourself moments when you get there.

"Amazing as this place is, Dale and I won't be getting over excited, it's just another part of the road we're on this year!"

Rally of Portugal finishes alongside the Atlantic Ocean in Matosinhos tomorrow (Sunday) afternoon.

About the Drive DMACK Fiesta Trophy

The brainchild of M-Sport World Rally Team principal Malcolm Wilson and DMACK managing director Dick Cormack, the DDFT takes the best young drivers from around the world and pitches them into a five-round fight for the biggest prize south of the World Rally Championship itself.

There's a season in a Ford Fiesta R5 car at rallying's second tier – WRC2 – on offer to the winner after five rounds. The structure of DDFT has changed slightly this season, with rallies being paired (Portugal and Poland; Poland and Finland; Germany and Spain) and the crew gathering the most points from each of those two rallies will win two rallies in the R5 car next season.

Winning a full WRC2 season of 2017 competition in an M-Sport Fiesta R5 will require consistent speed from Osian and Dale this year.

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
