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Sweden's leading business school chooses Swedish IT infrastructure from Nordlo

The Stockholm School of Economics (SSE) is moving large parts of its infrastructure to Nordlo's private cloud solution hosted in Swedish data centres.

"Data sovereignty and maintaining control over our data are absolutely essential. We have high requirements for both security and ease of use, and working with a Swedish partner puts us in a stronger position to meet the requirements of GDPR and NIS2," says Pär Kempe, CTO at the Stockholm School of Economics.

The agreement between the Stockholm School of Economics and Nordlo covers infrastructure and operations, including server platforms, storage, monitoring and backup. In total, more than 100 servers and large volumes of data are being migrated to Nordlo's data centres in Stockholm.

The solution is based on Proxmox, an open-source virtualisation platform.

The migration has been under way since spring 2026 and is being carried out in stages to minimise disruption to operations.
