

YMCA worker Jenny's 'Humber hop'

A record number of people are set to bounce across the Humber bridge on space hoppers in a bid to raise funds for one initiative that's bringing families back together again.

For YMCA worker, Jenny Hodson, the 'sky's the limit' when it comes to fundraising – that's why she's decided to organise the biggest-ever bounce across the Humber bridge in aid of Community Games.

Last week the plucky 53-year-old skydived out of a plane, from 15,000ft, for the programme.

And despite having her feet firmly on the ground, now, she doesn't plan on keeping them that way for long.

The mum-of-one said she feels so passionately about the positive effect Community Games, which is backed by the Cabinet Office, has had on families and communities in the area she wants to ensure the initiative reaches as many people in Grimsby, Cleethorpes and Humber as possible.

Jenny said she feels enthusiastic about the project because she believes the Olympic and Paralympic legacy programme is helping to bring communities back together again.

She said:

"I never imagined when I first started organising Community Games that they would be such a success.

Each and every event that we have run has been unique in its own way.

Community Games is so much more than just a day out. These events are bringing families, friends and communities back together again in a way that – up until now - has been somewhat forgotten in this country.

Instead of communicating through text messages or emails, communities are able to re-engage with each other the old fashion way. In a world dominated by technology this is really refreshing to see."

Jenny plans on holding the Humber hop in June 1 next year.

She added:

"I am already taking down names of people who want to take part in the hop-a-thon across the Humber.

People are really enthusiastic about it already. The money generated from this event will be pumped directly back into the community giving people all over the region an opportunity to enjoy a free, fun-filled day out."

KEY FACTS:

Community Games:

- The Community Games programme was launched in the West Midlands in 2009 and was originally funded for three years by Legacy Trust UK, an independent charity set up to help build a lasting cultural and sporting legacy from the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games.
- Since its launch more than 750 games have already taken place involving more than 500,000 people.
- Community Games is inspired by the Wenlock Olympian Games founded by Dr William Penny Brookes in 1850 and still held annually in Much Wenlock, Shropshire. The Wenlock Olympian Games were the inspiration behind the modern Olympic and Paralympic Games when Baron Pierre du Coubertin, founder of the modern Olympic movement, visited the games in 1890. The Community Games programme pays homage to a community event that inspired a global event, and now uses that global event to inspire a new raft of community events.

Legacy Trust UK:

- Legacy Trust UK is an independent charity set up to create a lasting cultural and sporting legacy from London 2012 in communities across the UK.
- The Trust is funded by a £40 million endowment from the Big Lottery Fund (£29m), Department for Culture Media and Sport (£6m) and Arts Council England (£5m), and is a Principal Funder of the Cultural Olympiad and London 2012
