



Strong development of cloud services and improvements in Business Unit West

July - September 2019

- Revenues decreased by 3% to SEK 701 (725) million. Change in local currencies was -4%.
- Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 36.9 (45.3) million.
- Profit before tax amounted to SEK 30.0 (37.4) million.
- Profit after tax amounted to SEK 24.2 (27.8) million.
- Profit per share amounted to 2.64 (3.02) SEK.
- New contracts relating to cloud services worth SEK 87 (70) million has been concluded, an increase by 24%.

Events after quarter ending

- On October 14th Proact acquired PeopleWare with estimated annual revenues of 28 MEUR and to a purchase price of EUR 17 million.

January - September 2019

- Revenues increased by 3% to SEK 2,417 (2,351) million. Change in local currencies was 1%.
- Adjusted EBITA amounted to SEK 116.8 (145.3) million. Items affecting comparability amounted to SEK -20.2 million related to reorganisation and divestment of subsidiary.
- Profit before tax amounted to SEK 79.0 (117.5) million. Adjusted for items affecting comparability, profit before tax amounted to SEK 99.2 (120.1) million.

Report by the CEO of Proact

"It's satisfying to see the positive development in our cloud services and the good result in Nordic. In addition, I have the pleasure of greeting PeopleWare warmly welcome to Proact."



This week, Proact acquired PeopleWare, a managed service provider based in the Netherlands and Belgium. With this acquisition Proact will significantly increase in size in the region, and thereby further increase our abilities to deliver highest quality services to one of our prioritized segments, mid-market. With the acquisition of PeopleWare, we follow our ambition to broaden the portfolio and the growth rate through acquisitions.

For the company in general, revenue and profits decreased during the third quarter compared to the same period last year. While we see a continued positive trend for cloud services, our revenue decreased by 3 percent to SEK 701 (725) million, which reflects declining sales for the systems business including complementary support and consulting services.

EBITA amounted to SEK 36.9 (45.3) million, corresponding to an EBITA margin of 5.3 (6.3) percent.

Our cloud services revenue, increased by 15 percent, reaching SEK 123 million for the quarter. New contracts for cloud services signed during the quarter amounted to SEK 87 (70) million, a 24 percent increase compared to the same period last year. During the quarter, systems revenue fell by 7 percent, while systems revenue increased with 4 percent for the first nine month of the year.

Despite challenges in Business Unit West the results increased compared to the second quarter in 2019 as a result of our recovery initiatives. Yet, the third quarter was weaker compared to the same period last year. This is mainly due to lower system sales as well as related support and consulting services income. Total revenue for the quarter decreased by 25 percent to SEK 177 (235) million. Cloud services increased by 19 percent.

In the Netherlands, we see a trend where organisations are evaluating new ways of consuming IT together with Proact through hybrid deployment models, which is causing some delays in investments. With the acquisition of PeopleWare, Proact in the Netherlands and in Belgium have an even better opportunity to meet customer demands around hybrid cloud services.

For Germany, systems sales decreased compared to the same period last year, mainly due to continued challenges in the sales organisation. While the result in Germany is negative in the quarter, I am optimistic about our recovery initiatives which will improve sales performance and lower our costs.

I am not satisfied with our third quarter results, but at the same time enthusiastic about our acquisition in the Netherlands. It is gratifying to see the positive development in our cloud services, where new agreements were signed during the quarter to a value of SEK 87 (80) million, an increase with 24 percent compared to the same period last year. It is also positive to see the strong increase in Business Unit Nordic. I'm confident that Proact has great opportunities to capitalize on the ongoing market transformation and to reach our long-term financial targets.

The Group's development

Revenues and result

Third quarter

For the third quarter 2019, total revenues amounted to SEK 701 (725) million, a decrease by 3%. Change in local currencies was -4%.

For the third quarter, system revenues decreased by 7% to SEK 415 (447) million. During the same period, service revenues increased by 3% to SEK 285 (277) million. Service revenues represented 41% of total revenues for the quarter.

New contracts relating to cloud services worth SEK 87 (70) million SEK has been concluded during the quarter, an increase by 24%. The contracts has terms of three to five years. Total revenues from cloud services amounted to SEK 123 (107) million, an increase by 15%. Revenues from cloud services amounted to SEK 470 million over period of 12 consecutive months.

Adjusted EBITA decreased compared to previous year and amounted for the quarter to SEK 36.9 (45.3) million. The lower EBITA is mainly due to lower revenue from system sales and a lower gross margin, including depreciations, within services. Comparatively, sales and administration costs have decreased by 1% during the quarter. Profit before tax amounted to SEK 30.0 (37.4) million.

IFRS 16 has, for the quarter, affected profit before tax with SEK -2.1 million and EBITA with SEK -0.6 million.

January-September

Total revenues for the first nine months amounted to SEK 2,417 (2,351) million, an increase by 3%. Change in local currencies was 1%.

For the first nine months, system revenues increased by 4% to SEK 1,567 (1,504) million. During the same period, service revenues increased by 1% to SEK 849 (844) million. Service revenues represented 35% of total revenues for the period.

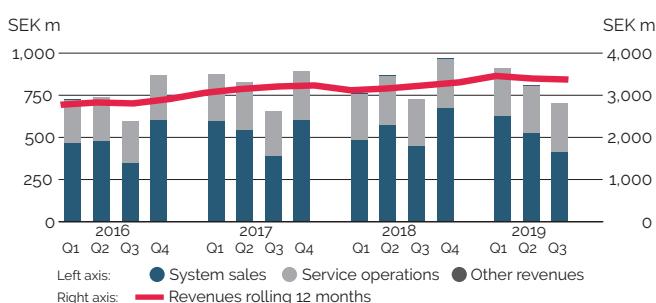
Adjusted EBITA decreased by 20% compared to previous year and amounted for the period to SEK 116.8 (145.3) million. The lower EBITA is mainly due to lower profitability within system sales due to a number of larger deals with lower margin during the first quarter of the year and a lower gross margin, including depreciations, within services. Comparatively, sales and administration costs have increased by 1% during the first nine month of the year. Profit before tax amounted to SEK 30.0 (37.4) million. Profit before tax decreased by 33% and amounted SEK 79.0 (117.5) million. Adjusted for items affecting comparability during 2019 (SEK 20.2 million), decrease was 17%.

IFRS 16 has, for the first nine months, affected profit before tax with SEK -6.3 million and EBITA with SEK -2.2 million.

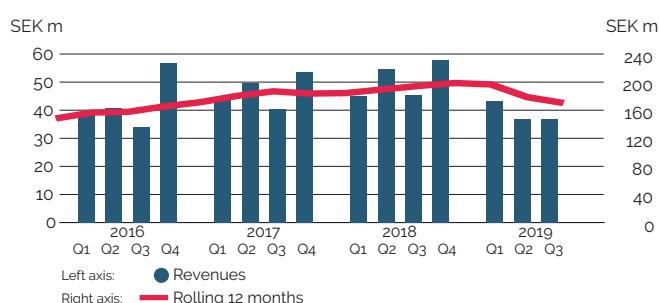

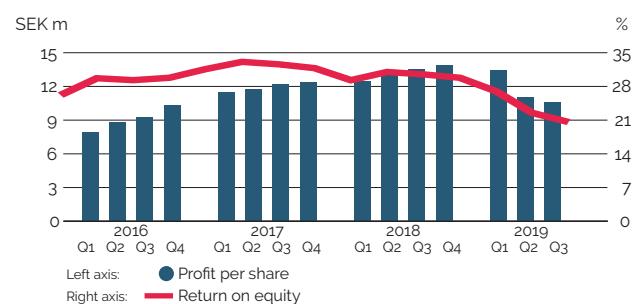

Cash flow

Third quarter

Cash flow for the third quarter was SEK -5 (6) million, of which SEK 44 (35) million from operating activities.

January-September

For the first nine months, cash flow was SEK -70 (-72) million, of which SEK 121 (77) million from operating activities. Changes in bank loans and utilisation of overdraft facilities have, in total no impact on cash flow. Dividends amounting to SEK 38 million has been paid to the parent company's shareholders. Rolling 12 months cash flow amounted to SEK 41 million.

Investments

During the first nine months SEK 73 (58) million has been invested in fixed assets. During the same period, SEK - (60) million was paid out in cash for acquisition of shares in subsidiaries.

Financial position

Cash and cash equivalent amounted to SEK 217 million as at 30 September 2019, compared to SEK 166 million previous year. Of total bank overdraft facilities of SEK 255 million, SEK 7 million has been utilised. Bank loans amounted to SEK 111 million and relate to a three-year revolving credit facility. Investments in IT-equipment for the cloud operations are financed through leasing agreements. Impact on the balance sheet and cash flow from transition to accounting in accordance with IFRS 16 "Leasing" as from January 1, 2019 is shown in Note 1 in this report.

The Group's equity ratio at the end of the period was 23%. As per year-end 2018, the equity ratio was 21%.

Income tax

The group's tax expense includes total current tax and deferred tax calculated based on applicable tax rates in the respective countries. Reported tax cost for the first nine months 2019 amounts to SEK 20.4 (29.3) million, corresponding to an efficient tax rate of 26 (25)%.

Buy-back of own shares

At the Annual General Meeting held on 9 May 2019, the Board of Directors were authorized to acquire up to 10% of the company's shares by the next Annual General Meeting. As at 30 September 2019, no shares have been acquired under this authorisation.

The company holds 182,269 shares in its own custody as at 30 September, which is equivalent to 2.0% of the total numbers of shares.

Employees

The company employed 835 (822) as at September 30, 2019.

Parent Company in brief

Parent Company's total revenues for the period amounted to SEK 70.9 (65.6) million. Profit before tax amounted to SEK 22.9 (-0.6) million.

Parent Company's liabilities in a joint group currency account amounted as at 30 September 2019 to SEK 306 (279) million.

At the end of the period, the number of people employed by the parent company totalled 17 (13).

Parent Company's operations have remained unchanged over the period. There have been no significant transactions with related parties.

Nordics

Revenue and result

Third quarter

In Nordics, revenues increased by 30% during the quarter compared to the previous year. Revenues from system sales increased by 48%, while revenues from service operation remained unchanged.

In Nordics, profit was positively affected by the good system sales. Profitability in both system and service operations remained largely unchanged compared to the corresponding period last year. At the same time, sales and administration costs were also unchanged.

January-September

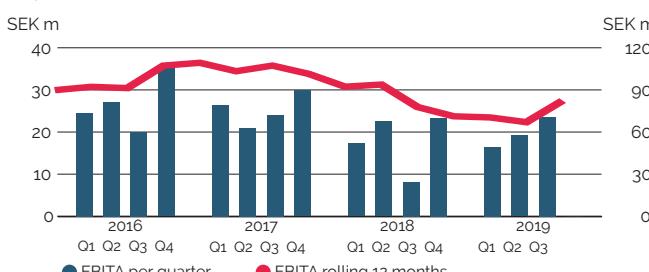
In Nordics, revenues increased by 17% during the first nine months compared with the corresponding period last year. Revenues from system operations increased by 28%, while revenues from service operations decreased by 6%. The decrease is due to a few large service contracts concluded during the first half of 2018. The EBITA margin improved from 4.6% to 4.9% during the period

UK

Revenue and result

Third quarter

In the UK, revenues fell by 26% during the quarter compared to the previous year. The decrease is mainly attributable to the system operations, and related support and consulting services, as the market is pending as a result of Brexit. Cloud service revenues increased by 12% compared to the corresponding quarter last year.

In the UK, earnings were negatively impacted by lower system-related revenues despite improved profitability in system operations and lower sales and administration costs.

January-September

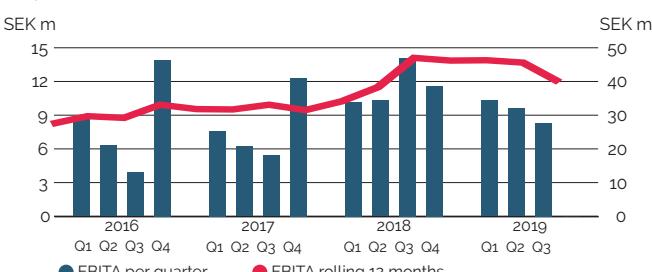
In the UK, revenue fell during the first nine months by 15%. Revenue from system operations decreased by 29%, while revenue from cloud services increased by 15%. The EBITA margin has deteriorated from 7.0% to 6.7%.

West

Revenue and result

Third quarter

In the West, revenues decreased by 25% during the quarter compared to the corresponding period last year. System revenues decreased by 39 % while service revenues remained unchanged, however, cloud service revenues increased by 19%.

In the West, earnings deteriorated during the quarter mainly due to lower system revenues and associated support and consulting services. The biggest deviation in earnings is still attributable to the German operations where system sales were weak, while previously implemented investments regarding increased market presence in northern Germany have led to a negative result. The result in West has improved compared to second quarter this year, implying that the improvement measures that have been initiated produces results.

January-September

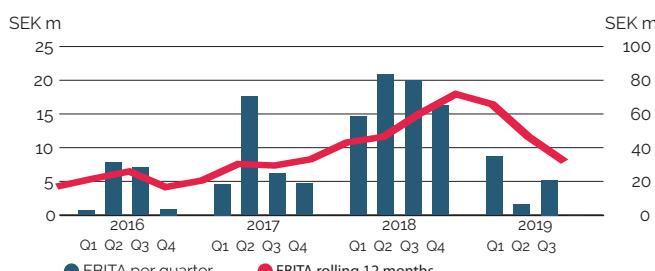
In the West, revenues fell by 10% in the first nine months compared to the same period last year. System revenues decreased by 16% while service revenues increased by 2%. Cloud services revenue increased by 24%. In the West, the adjusted EBITA margin deteriorated from 7.6% to 2.4% due to lower system revenues combined with decreased gross margin and lower consulting income.

In East, revenues increased by 30% during the first nine months of the year.

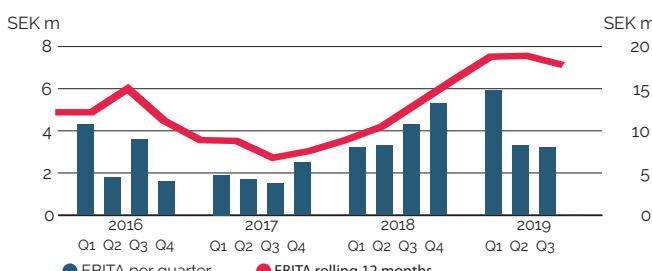
The EBITA margin decreased from 9.8% to 8.7% due to lower profitability in the service business and higher sales costs.

Market Review

Understanding market trends, identifying new technology with commercial potential, and then building competence around this is something Proact always have been strong in. In this way, we can be at the forefront of the market's development and establish ourselves early in segments where demand is expected to grow.

This is a successful cornerstone of our strategy – but we are also seeing some major, widespread trends from the buyers.

For our customers, IT has historically been a tool mainly for rationalisation and efficiency. In particular, with Proact's focus on data centres, sales have largely been driven by new technology with a constantly improving price/performance ratio.

Well-functioning IT delivery is, of course, a prerequisite for any organisation to run efficiently, but the ongoing digital transformation adds a new dimension giving IT an even greater strategic importance.

Cost savings and/or efficiency are no longer the main drivers of customer IT investments. Instead, people are expecting IT to drive business development, business revenue and business growth.

Flexibility and hybrid delivery models

To drive business and business development through IT, there is a strong and widespread vision of a cloud-based IT infrastructure. However, there are very few organisations in Proact's segments that can, or will, put everything into public clouds. This could be for any number of reasons, including data sovereignty, data regulations, organisations' internal policies, security concerns, cost implications and latency issues, to name but a few.

Instead, we are seeing that most of our customers choose a hybrid solution that takes advantage of the benefits of traditional IT infrastructure, managed cloud services, private cloud services and public cloud services.

However, this type of hybrid delivery model adds complexity. Organisations face new challenges, especially relating to security and networking – and this opens up new opportunities for systems and cloud integrators with a strong range of services and expertise.

Other information

Events after the balance sheet date

On October 14th, Proact published a press release about the acquisition of PeopleWare. Proact's acquisition of the top-ranking IT managed services provider PeopleWare enhances Proact's market presence in the Netherlands and Belgium and adds expertise for delivering high-growth managed cloud services into the medium sized enterprise segment. The purchase price amounts up to EUR 17 million and is based on 2019 full year performance, corresponding to 8x adjusted EBITA. The purchase price will be released at its full during a 24 month period post-closing. PeopleWare has a yearly revenue of approximately EUR 28 million and will be consolidated into the group results as of now. The acquisition is financed through bank loan of EUR 14 million and EUR 3 million in cash. The company is consolidated as from the date of acquisition. At the time of publication of this report, it does not exist financial statements that can form the basis for a detailed description of the acquisition. For this reason, no information is provided on the fair value of acquired assets and acquired liabilities.

Transactions with related parties

No transactions between Proact and related parties, which have significantly affected the Group's position and profits, have taken place during the quarter.

Risks and uncertainty factors within the enterprise

The company has in the current situation difficulties to assess consequences' of United Kingdom's forthcoming exit from EU. Short term, currency rate effects will affect the group's financial statements. Otherwise, no risks or uncertainty factors have altered, by comparison with those commented upon in the last Annual Report issued. For a more detailed description of significant risks and uncertainty factors, please see Proact's annual report for 2018, page 26.

Alternative Performance Measures

Explanatory information

Note 1 ► Accounting principles

The consolidated accounts for the interim report, like the annual report for 2018, have been compiled in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) as endorsed by the EU, and the Swedish Annual Accounts Act. The Parent Company's accounts have been compiled in accordance with the Annual Accounts Act and the Swedish Financial Reporting Board's recommendation RFR 2 (Accounting for Legal Entities). The Group applies the same accounting principles as those described in the annual report for 2018 with the addition of IFRS 16, as described below.

As of January 1, 2019, Proact applies IFRS 16 Leasing, which replaces IAS 17 Leases. Proact applies the simplified transition method and the main impact on the company's reporting is from the accounting of IT equipment and leases for premises. The change means that leasing contracts (with the exception of short-term lease contracts and leasing contracts of lesser value) are reported as a rights to use and a leasing debt in the balance sheet. The opening effect for the Group at the transition on January 1, 2019 entails in the balance sheet a Right of Use assets of SEK 225 million, a leasing liability of SEK 217 million and an adjustment for prepaid leasing fees of SEK 8 million. In the statement of comprehensive income, the linear operating leasing cost is replaced by a cost for depreciation of the right of use assets and an interest expense attributable to the leasing liability. Proact uses different discount rates depending on the terms of the agreements.

Financial instruments

Proact's financial instruments consist of derivatives, accounts receivable, cash and cash equivalents, accounts pay-able, accrued trade creditors and interest-bearing liabilities. Derivative instruments are recognized in the balance sheet as per the contract date and are valued at fair value, both initially and in subsequent revaluations. All derivatives are reported continuously at fair value with the value changes reported in the statement of comprehensive income within cost sold for those derivatives that are linked to accounts payable and financial items for the derivatives that are linked to financial leasing contracts. Derivatives are valued at fair value within level 2, ie fair value determined on the basis of valuation techniques with observable market data, either directly (as price) or indirectly (hence to price). All other financial assets have been classified as loans and receivables, which includes accounts receivable and cash and cash equivalents. All other financial liabilities have been classified as other financial liabilities valued at amortized cost, which includes accounts payable, accrued supplier costs and liabilities to credit institutions. Liabilities to credit institutions run at variable interest rates, and reported interest rates are on a par with current interest on liabilities to credit institutions and other financial assets and liabilities with short maturities. Based on this, the book values of all financial assets and liabilities are judged to be a reasonable estimate of fair value.
