Scandinavian Enviro Systems contributes to enhanced environmental and economic sustainability using a patented technology for the recovery of valuable raw materials from scrapped and end-of-life products, including tires. The production of new tires using carbon black recovered with Enviro's technology reduces carbon dioxide emissions by up to 93 per cent compared with the use of virgin carbon black. Enviro has its head office in Gothenburg and a plant for the recycling of end-of-life tires in Åsensbruk. The largest owner is the French tire manufacturer Michelin. Enviro was founded in 2001 and is listed on Nasdaq First North Growth Market. www.envirosystems.se

A quarter with extensive preparatory work ahead of the definitive investment decision regarding Uddevalla

Following a first quarter focused on preparing for the agreement with Antin, the second quarter was dominated by extensive preparatory work ahead of the definitive investment decision regarding the plant in Uddevalla. It is reasonable that this required considerable work given that the decision and the plant in Uddevalla are vital for several future key activities and for the execution of the joint-venture company's entire expansion plan. However, it is clear that we underestimated the amount of work that this would involve and how long it would take.

Coming to an agreement with Antin required many long negotiations and was a decisive step towards completing our expansion plan since it enabled us to fulfil several crucial prerequisites for our commercialization and industrialization. However, it also meant that the ongoing work on the establishment of the plant in Uddevalla became the responsibility of the new joint-venture company, and that several completely new board members needed to read and familiarize themselves with all the material. Since both we and our partner have a very long-term view of our joint investment and the business model it is based on, careful preparation before our first investment decision is of course of the utmost importance. It is also important to remember that the planned plant in Uddevalla is not only one of several upcoming plants, but the first plant that the joint-venture company will construct, meaning that a lot is riding on it. The process for investment decisions that is now being established will be used in the future for every new plant, and the foundation we are establishing will make future decisions more efficient. Rigorous preparations are therefore both important and desirable.

What are the preparations that must be undertaken ahead of the future decision? To begin with, we must of course be able to report in detail on the cost of the investments that need to be made and select the suppliers that will be responsible for various important partial deliveries to the plant. As before, we also need to secure agreements for deliveries of end-of-life tires and delivery agreements for recovered material. Back when we announced the agreement with Antin, we also announced that Michelin had signed multi-year delivery agreements for the first plants constructed. However, given the planned total recycling capacity, we will be able to deliver to companies other than Michelin and we are therefore initiating discussions with several potential strategic customers. The same applies to deliveries of tire raw materials, for which we have also started discussions with several different players. The need for our recovered materials and our solution for more sustainable management of end-of-life tires is, and will remain, considerable, which puts us in an excellent negotiating position.

Naturally, all agreements must also be reviewed externally from all legal perspectives. During the quarter, the joint-venture company engaged its own legal advisers to ensure that all agreements signed will guarantee effective operations. Once again, preparations and diligence take time but are important and desirable in the long term when it comes to ensuing a long-term successful and effective roll-out and operations.

The fact that the upcoming investment decision is linked to several other milestones result in a requirement for rigorous preparations too. A decision on the investment in Uddevalla also means that Enviro will receive compensation from the joint venture company for the costs that the company has incurred in connection with Uddevalla, which is important for the company's finances. An investment decision is also an important step in terms of the process of buying into a joint-venture company, since buying into the venture will only create value once the decision has been made. There is

therefore a lot riding on the upcoming investment decision, but the same can also be said about our future plant. Aside from being the joint-venture company's first full-scale plant, it is also vital for the execution of the joint-venture company's future expansion plan. As we previously announced, the successful commissioning of the Uddevalla plant will be the launching pad for the build-out of plants in Europe, with the goal of having the capacity to recycle one million metric tons per year by 2030. In this regard, I would also like to repeat what we already confirmed in conjunction with the announcement of the joint-venture company: that the plant in Uddevalla is expected to be fully operational in 2025.

I would like to conclude with a few words on the directed share issue that we successfully implemented at the start of May. In addition to strengthening our cash base by MSEK 300 (before issue costs), the directed issue led to several prominent institutional investors becoming some of the company's largest owners, which is something we have aimed to achieve for several years. With a clearly improved cash base and leading industrial and financial players as owners and partners, Enviro finds itself in a very strong position. Having fought to commercialize and industrialize our leading technology for over a decade, I would like to emphasize that the progress we have made in this respect over the past two years is a crucial milestone in our efforts to realize our strategy.

Financial summary

Q2 2023

Group revenue and results

Net revenues for the period were MSEK 3.6 (1.9). Operating results totalled MSEK -23.8 (-21.4), and earnings after tax were MSEK -25.3 (-21.3).

The decrease of the result compared to last year with MSEK 4.0 is mainly running maintenance and freight costs in connection with the plant in Asensbruk, consultancy costs and costs in connection with the bridge financing that was agreed and communicated in Q1 – totally MSEK 2,6 higher. The personnel costs were MSEK 1.4 higher than during the same period last year due to strengthening of the staff in both the parent company and the subsidiary, as well as running reservations related to the stay-on bonus to key employees in connection with the incentive programme LTIP 2021/2024, which was approved by the Annual General Meeting. All employees concerned are still employed within the group. Further the depreciation has been MSEK 0.1 higher than during the same period in 2022. On the other hand, the gross profit is MSEK 1.6 higher than last year. Finally, the financial net was MSEK 1,5 negative than during the same period last year due to the earlier communicated bridge financing.

Investments and financial standing

Investments of the group in fixed assets MSEK 8.7 (10.0). consist of addi amounted to consist additional investments investments in the plant in Asensbruk, as well as parts of a so-called Detailed Design (DD), which applies to engineering hours for the Uddevalla plant. The cash flow from operating activities after investing activities the **MSEK** for period were -27.0 (-25.8).

The decrease in the cashflow is mainly due a lower operating result before adjustments of working capital of MSEK 3.9. On the other hand, the changes in working capital costs have been positive with MSEK 1.5 during the period compared to last year. Additional to that, the investments have been MSEK 1.3 lower compared to the same period 2022.

During the quarter Enviro received, as communicated in the latest report, proceeds of MSEK 300 before transactions costs via a directed rights issue.

JANUARY - JUNE 2023

Group revenues and results

Net revenues for the period were MSEK 7.7 (3.3). Operating results totalled MSEK -47.8

(-39.2), and earnings after tax were MSEK -49.7(-39.1).

The decrease of the result compared to last year with MSEK 10.6 is explained of higher external costs of MSEK 7.5 compared with the same period in 2022, mainly in connection with lawyer and consultancy support, higher electrical costs in the plant in Asensbruk as well as costs in connection with the new short-term loan, earlier in the year. The personnel costs were totally MSEK 5,5 higher than during the same period last year due to strengthening of the staff in both the parent company and the subsidiary. In addition to that depreciation has been MSEK 0.2 higher and the finance net has been MSEK 1.9 negative compared to the same period last year due to the new short-term loan (a bridge financing), which was agreed in February. On the other hand, the gross profit has been MSEK 4.5 higher mainly thanks to an oil delivery during Q1 2023.

Investments and financial standing

Investments of the group in fixed assets amounted to MSEK 16.1 (19.5). The investments consist of mainly of parts of a so-called Detailed Design (DD), which applies to engineering hours for the Uddevalla plant, but also of additional investments in the plant in Asensbruk. The cash flow from operating activities after investing activities for the period were MSEK -56.0 (-47.6).

The decrease in the cashflow is mainly due to a lower operating result before adjustments of working capital of MSEK 10.4. Added to that, the changes in working capital with the exception of the above-mentioned rights issue costs the change in working capital has been negative during the period with MSEK 1.4 compared to the same period last year. The investments have been MSEK 3.4 lower compared to the same period in 2022.

During the quarter Enviro received, as communicated in the latest report, proceeds of MSEK 300 before transactions costs via a directed rights issue. Through the share issue, the number of shares in the Company have increased by 150,000,000 from 656,615,589 to 806,615,589 and the share capital has increased by SEK 6,000,000 from SEK 26,264,623.56 to SEK 32,264,623.56. The dilution equals approximately 18.6 percent based on the total number of shares in Enviro after the directed share issue.

Added to that, Enviro secured short-term/bridge financing via an external loan (bridge financing) of MSEK 40 as well as receiving a reprieve from the tax authority of MSEK 17.

During Q1 Enviro announced that they together with Antin Infrastructure Partners and with the support of Michelin have

established a joint venture in order to, based on Enviro's technology, create the world's first large-scale tire recycling group.

The group cash amounted to MSEK 329.3 (81.3 at the end of the period.

The equity/assets ratio was 78 (87) percent.

Parent company

The net revenues for the parent company totalled MSEK 1.6 (2.5), and the result after tax was MSEK -45.7 (-35.5). Around 100 (63) percent of the turnover are sales related to group companies for internal services. For the rest the company has incurred higher external expenses of MSEK 5.0 compared to the same period in 2022, mainly consultancy and lawyer expenses as well as costs in connection with a new short-term loan from previously this year. The staff costs are MSEK 2,6 higher than during the same period last year due to strengthening of the staff. The investments in fixed assets amounted to MSEK 11.4 (14.2). The investments of the year are mainly related to parts of a so-called Detailed Design (DD), which applies to engineering hours for the Uddevalla plant.

The Equity/assets ratio at the period-end was 83 (94) percent.

Staff and Organisation

The group has 37 (27) employees at the period-end.

Executed transactions with related parties

in the parent company, for 2023 consultancy fees to P 30 Ltd, (Peter Möller, board member), of MSEK 0.9 (0.6) have been included. In addition to that consultancy fees to Blomqvist Unlimited AB (Alf Blomqvist, chairman of the board) of MSEK 0.7 (0.6) have been included. Further, consultancy fees to M

& K Industrials AB (Nina Macpherson, board member) of MSEK 0.1 (0.0) have been included. These transactions are evaluated by the company management to be according to market conditions.

Number of shares

Total shares outstanding at the end of the period was 806,615,589 (656,615,589).

Risks and uncertainties

A detailed description of risks and uncertainty factors is provided on page 39 and 52 of the annual report of 2022. Covid-19 could have a negative effect on the commercialisation of the company, not least through potential imbalances in logistical flows and/or lock-down situations of societies or partly thereof. The war in Ukraine has indirectly led to higher costs for the group, hereunder higher energy costs. Additional to that, the war could imply a negative effect on the will to invest.

FINANCIAL KEY RATIOS Accounting policies

The consolidated reports for the group are prepared in compliance with the Swedish Annual Accounts Act, and BFNAR 2012:1 Annual Accounts and Consolidated Financial Statements (K3). Applicable accounting policies are detailed in the company consolidated annual report note 1.
