

# BUMPER SEASON OF EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES FOR ENGLISH HERITAGE IN YORKSHIRE

From kings of England to the 'prince of darkness', spiritual reflection to hilarious history, 2013 is set to be a bumper year of events for English Heritage sites around the Yorkshire region, with something to appeal to visitors of all ages!

From Easter right through until Christmas, many of English Heritage's most popular sites throughout the region will welcome a host of historic re-enactors and interpreters to help visitors young and old to truly step into England's history, meeting characters from the past with a story to tell for visitors of the present.

"We've planned a wonderful series of events large and small this year, including family fun trails around Clifford's Tower, a summer of hilarious history at Scarborough Castle, and the return of the Knights' Tournament to Richmond Castle," comments regional events manager, Jon Hogan. "As Brodsworth Hall remembers World War II with a new exhibition, so our events will have a 1940s wartime theme, whilst Whitby Abbey will welcome the return of its acclaimed theatrical promenade performance of Dracula every weekend in the summer and family activities during all the school holidays."

Mount Grace Priory and Helmsley Castle will host summer evenings of classical performances, including Sense & Sensibility, Twelfth Night and Shakespeare's Comedy of

Errors in August, with more alfresco performance at Rievaulx Abbey every Sunday in June

with medieval music from a troop of wandering minstrels.

"All of our daytime events – including our highlight events – are free for English Heritage

members, which includes admission for up to six children going free with each adult

member, so anyone watching the pennies this year can enjoy a bumper season of days out

from just £35 per person," adds Jon.

## EASTER FAMILY FUN WITH ENGLISH HERITAGE IN YORKSHIRE

After a long winter, families searching for an excuse to shrug off the scarves and head outdoors for some spring fresh air need look no further than their local English Heritage site, with many of its sites reopening daily, and family fun trails with a chocolate treat at the end!

At Clifford's Tower in York, Richmond Castle and Whitby Abbey – traditionally known as the 'home of Easter' thanks to the Synod of Whitby agreeing the date of Easter nearly 1350 years ago – family fun trails will ensure that children explore every nook and cranny of the ruins to find all the clues. Onlywhen their trail sheets are completed will they receive their reward – a small Lindt chocolate bunny! The trails run daily from 10.00am to 6.00pm over the Easter weekend (29 March to 1 April).

At Brodsworth Hall, near Doncaster, a rewarding trail will also be on offer for the whole of the Easter holidays – Friday 29 March to 14 March – which is no mean feat considering that the historic country house will be entering a period of rationing and make-do-and-mend during 2013 as it remembers the impact of World War II on the family, staff and community of the Brodsworth Estate. Thankfully, Easter eggs will not be of the powdered variety, but children may be shocked by how much of their rationing allowance the chocolate prize on offer over the Easter weekend would use up! The trail runs daily from 11.00am to 5.00pm around the restored Victorian gardens, which will once again be starting to bloom.

At Rievaulx Abbey, near Helmsley, there will be no chicks – just full-grown birds, as the site marks Easter with displays of medieval falconry, the sport of kings! The event focuses on the early medieval period, when falconry became an integral part of royal life – the age when castles were being built with an eye not only on their strategic position, but also the abundance of hunting grounds in the vicinity. Master falconers Mike and Emma Raphael will host three days of aerial displays from Good Friday 29 March to Easter Monday (1 April),

and also give visitors a chance to see some of the magnificent raptors up close in the tented

Hawk Mews.

"Easter is a celebration of rebirth, and for many of our sites, that is exactly what you get – a new season with daily opening at many of our historic castles, abbeys and houses, with many people taking advantage of the long bank holiday weekend and school holidays to start venturing outdoors once again," comments Gemma Sneyd, marketing manager for English Heritage in Yorkshire. "Whether you want family fun at one of our sites hosting Easter trails, or you are looking for the peace and quiet with beautiful scenery at sites like Mount Grace Priory, we look after some of the most stunning venues in the region, with a warm welcome across Yorkshire."

Indeed, spring offers unique experiences at many of English Heritage's properties, from the blooming of the vibrant purple fairy foxgloves at Middleham Castle – which has enjoyed a huge surge in interest in recent months thanks to the discovery of the body of Richard III, who spent his childhood at the castle, to the spectacular spring views from Scarborough Castle, where you can watch brave souls entering the sea in the North and South Bays whilst enjoying a piping hot drink from the on-site café.

## THE EASTER CHICKS ARE ALL GROWN UP AT RIEVAULX ABBEY

Falconry of Kings, Friday 29 March – Easter Monday 1 April

Rievaulx Abbey near Helmsley will play host to a range of feathered visitors over the Easter weekend, but visitors expecting fluffy yellow chicks might be a bit of a surprise as these birds are some of the finest hunters in the country, as Raphael Falconry demonstrates the 'sport of kings'!

The three days, a rare collection of falcons, hawks and even owls will take to the sky above the Cistercian ruins, with master falconers Mike and Emma Raphael demonstrating how early medieval kings built up falconry from being a simple leisure pursuit into a demonstration of skill and status for royals and nobles alike!

"During the Plantagenet period, you start to see a real rise in the popularity of hunting with birds – indeed, the period is known as the 'flowering of falconry' – culminating in the reign of Edward I, who was nicknamed the 'Falconer King'," explains English Heritage's regional events manager, Jonathan Hogan. "This is the period when falconry became far more visually flamboyant, with the introduction of dress hoods for the birds, and 'showing' the birds became far more popular."

For kings and wealthy nobles, flying a rare bird was the ultimate in prestige. One of the birds that visitors should see over the Easter weekend is the Jer Falcon, a bird so rare that only kings would have been able to afford one. Native to the Arctic Circle, the Jer Falcon is the large falcon in the world.

Amongst the other birds taking part in the aerial acrobatics will be a Peregrine Falcon,

Shaker Falcon – a bird that was particularly popular during the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> centuries as it was often brought back as a living souvenir of the Crusades – hunting hawks and kestrels.

'Falconry of Kings' runs from 12 noon until 5.00pm on Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Sunday and Monday (29 March - 1 April), with the site additionally opening from 10.00am to 6.00pm each day. Admission prices are £6.50 for adults, £6.00 for concessions and £4.50 for children. English Heritage members get in free.

## WHITBY ABBEY - THE HOME OF EASTER...

#### ... and why Easter always falls on a Sunday!

The date of Easter changes each year, falling anytime between 22 March and 25 April, but as many people enjoy the family fun trail around Whitby Abbey this Easter weekend (29 March to 1 April), how many will realise that its date was agreed on the very site on which they stand?

As with many Christian festivals, the date of Easter was probably chosen to co-incide with existing religious traditions, and early Christians aligned their celebrations with the Jewish feast of Passover, itself calculated based on a lunar calendar. In 325AD, the First Council of Nicea agreed that all Christians should celebrate Easter on a Sunday, as St John's Gospel identified Sunday as the day on which Jesus rose.

As different Christian communities developed, different orders used different calculation tables and protocols to determine the date for Easter, resulting in monks from the influential Christian order on Iona eventually celebrating Easter on a different date to the Roman Church. Nowhere was the disagreement more obvious than the kingdom of Northumbria, where King Oswiu celebrated the feast on a different week to Queen Eanfled – so whilst one Royal court was fasting as part of Lent, the other would be feasting and celebrating!

The problem came to a head when the Ionan order was replaced in Ripon by Wilfred, who

had trained in Rome. With leading clergy within the kingdom disagreeing on the date of

Easter, a Synod was called by the Northumbrian princess Hild, who was the founding abbess

of Whitby Abbey, then known as Streonshalh. In 664, the Synod finally agreed to follow the

Roman calculations for Easter, bringing together the traditions in England for the first time.

The calculations agreed for Easter at this Synod are still used today to determine the date of

the celebrations, an indeed, this Synod is seen by many as the Celtic church bowing to the

Roman Catholic church – a decision that changed religion in England forever.

"As a result of this Synod, Whitby Abbey has become known as the 'home of Easter', so it

seems only fitting that people come and enjoy the site at this time of year," adds Whitby

Abbey's site manager, Sarah Bedlington. "Whether you are coming for tranquil reflection in

the historic ruins or coming to explore the Visitor Centre, it is a great way to spend a couple

of hours over the Easter period."

Whitby Abbey and its visitor centre are open daily from 10.00am to 6.00pm from 29 March.

Admission prices are £6.40 for adults, £5.80 for concessions and £3.80 for children. A family

ticket (two adults and up to three children) is priced at £16.60. Whitby Abbey's Easter

Family Fun Trail runs from Good Friday (29 March) until Easter Monday (1 April), with a

small chocolate treat for children completing the hunt around the ruins.

# RECREATING THE SECOND WORLD WAR AT BRODSWORTH HALL & GARDENS

#### **Events and new exhibition for 2013**

The impact of World War II on one of Yorkshire's great country houses, Brodsworth Hall near Doncaster, will be explored in a series of events throughout 2013, which will see the story of the building, the Grant-Dalton family who lived there and the residents of the Brodsworth estate retold 70 years on.

"During the Second World War, Brodsworth Hall was requisitioned for use by the army, but it was not only the army's occupation of the house that affected Brodsworth – men from the estate were called up into the army, or served in the Home Guard if they were farming, a 'reserved occupation'. A workforce comprised largely of women were left to manage the house and gardens, whilst the indomitable mistress of the house, Sylvia Grant-Dalton, led a valiant effort to support the troops overseas with a host of schemes and initiatives to galvanise local people into getting involved in the war effort," comments property manager, Paul Robson. "We'll be remembering all these different aspects of Brodsworth at War through a new exhibition in the Hall itself, and an array of events in the gardens."

Indeed, the events throughout the year condense the five years of World War II into a season, from an event marking the requisitioning of Brodsworth taking place over the May

Day bank holiday weekend (4-6 May 2013) to a 1940s fete over the weekend of 22 & 23 of June, recreating one of Sylvia's fundraising events featuring traditional stalls and a coconut

shy! Whilst 1940s songstresses, the Spitfire Girls, serenade the crowds, a full size replica

Spitfire will take pride of place on the lawn at the front of the house!

Young recruits will be put through their paces by a recruiting sergeant alongside members

of the 9 Army Group Royal Artillery as Brodsworth Hall demonstrates 'Training for D-Day' on

Saturday 10 and Sunday 11 August, with an impressive 5.5" gun transported to the site on a

Matador gun tractor especially for the occasion.

Over the May half term week, all eyes return to the Home Front, recreating Brodsworth's

very own version of the Dad's Army-favourites with the help of Pontefract Home Guard re-

enactors. Visitors will learn some of the tricks of the wartime make-do-and-mend culture,

which was heartily embraced by the Grant-Daltons, meet the local ARP wardens and even

learn about how some clever individuals managed to beat the rationing and put some extra

meat on the dinner table by employing the clever skills of the master falconer!

Complementing the war-time re-enactments will be Brodsworth Hall's usual series of

summer Sunday Afternoon Band Concerts, featuring many of South Yorkshire's top brass

bands, running every Sunday from 14 July until 29 September on the South Terrace. Visitors

on Saturdays in July, August and September (on weekend when there are no wartime

events) will be able to enjoy Victorian Garden Games, including skittles and quoits, on the

front lawn.

Brodsworth Hall's wartime events programme is part of "Duty Calls: Brodsworth Hall in Time of

War," a project which has been generously funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund. It is also part of a

wider initiative of the Yorkshire Country House Partnership, 'Duty Calls: The Country House in Time

of War", a series of exhibitions and activities exploring the impact of war on the country house and

its communities, on show throughout Yorkshire in 2013 and 2014.

Brodsworth's project has involved gathering of oral testimony from the local community, and the

exhibition at the hall. Visitors will be able to find out more about how the household and estate

faced the challenges of war, including sharing the house with the army and the evacuation of children from Leeds to the village to keep them safe from air raids and attacks. Several recordings of people's memories from this time can be listened to throughout the house. The exhibition also looks at the experiences of Brodsworth and its community in the First World War, and events are being planned for 2014.

## PATH TO PARADISE BRINGS SERENE MEANDERINGS TO WHITBY ABBEY

Saturday 25 May to Sunday 2 June 2013

It is believed that St Hild chose the clifftop at Whitby for her new abbey because of its isolation, and visitors over the half term holiday will be able to revisit Whitby Abbey as a place of contemplation when the site opens The Path to Paradise – an unusual labyrinth experience.

The Path to Paradise is designed as a contemplative walk around a pattern mown out of the lawns at Whitby, created to encourage quiet thought and understanding of the environment, taking inspiration from a design at Chartres Cathedral in France.

"This is a long way away from the labyrinths of ancient mythology; there are no stone walls and certainly no minotaur, in fact, you can see the end-point of the labyrinth from the start, as the pattern is cut out of grass that is only a few inches high," explains English Heritage's event manager, Jon Hogan. "However, the idea is that walking the route opens your mind to ponder some of the great questions in life. A labyrinth in an abbey such as Whitby would have been used almost as a meditation tool for the residents, to help them focus their thoughts on matters spiritual whilst gaining some exercise within a relatively confined space.

Visitors today can share this sense of peace – discovering the labyrinth for themselves and following the path to enlightenment – meeting some interesting characters along the way!"

Indeed, actors from North Country Theatre will help visitors on their journey through the

labyrinth with stories and gems of wisdom for anyone following the path. "For the 21st

century visitor, the labyrinth can be whatever they want it to be, whether our younger

visitors want to see how quickly they can race from the start to the end, or whether it is a

relaxing meander around the paths with regular stops to enjoy the fresh air and the view -

the route to enlightenment is whatever you want it to be!" adds Jon.

The Path to Paradise runs daily at Whitby Abbey from 10.00am to 6.00pm, with the actors

from North Country Theatre taking up their positions from 11.00am to 4.00pm each day.

Admission prices are £6.40 for adults, £5.80 for concessions and £3.80 for children. A family

ticket (two adults and up to three children) is priced at £16.60.

#### **About Brodsworth Hall & Gardens**

Brodsworth Hall was built in the 1860s in the Italianate style also favoured for Queen Victoria's Osborne House, though furnished on a more comfortable and domestic scale. Much of its original scheme survives today, making it one of England's most unaltered Victorian country houses. The gardens, a collection of 'grand gardens in miniature', have been restored to their Victorian splendour, reflecting the desires and aspirations of Victorian country gentry.

Brodsworth's builder was Charles Thellusson, whose wealthy family devoted themselves to yachting and horse-racing. The magnificent silver Goodwood Cup, won by a Thellusson ancestor's racehorse in 1835, has recently been purchased by English Heritage to rejoin the racing mementos still on display at Brodsworth.

The house was occupied in unbroken succession by members of the Thellusson family and their accumulated impedimenta, a factor which lends it special charm. The last resident, the indomitable Sylvia Grant-Dalton, fought a losing battle against subsidence and leaking roofs for 56 years. Following her death in 1988, English Heritage then made the bold but highly successful decision to conserve the interiors 'as found' rather than replacing or restoring them, recounting the tale of how a once opulent Victorian house grew comfortably old and inviting to all.

The family gardens have been substantially restored since English Heritage took over management of the property in 1990: they are now a fine example of 1860s 'gardening book' design. Many years of pruning and tree removal have opened up vistas last enjoyed before World War I.

The flower garden displays a fine selection of period bedding plants, and the romantic views from the restored summer-house take in the quarry garden, paths, bridges and garden buildings. Of special interest are the restored woodland garden, the statue walks and the fern dell, planted with unusual specimens.

There is also an adventure play area for children at the site, further expanding its appeal to family visitors.

# About Clifford's Tower

In 1068-9, William the Conqueror built two motte and bailey castles in York, to strengthen his military hold on the north. Clifford's Tower, an unusual four-lobed keep built in the 13th century atop the mound of William's larger fortress, is now the principal surviving stonework remnant of York's medieval castle. The sweeping views of the city from the tower still show why it played such an important part in controlling northern England.

# **About Helmsley Castle**

Surrounded by spectacular banks and ditches, the great medieval castle's impressive ruins stand beside the attractive market town of Helmsley. The fortress was probably begun after 1120 by Walter Espec - 'Walter the Woodpecker'. Renowned for piety as well as soldiering, this Norman baron of 'gigantic stature' also founded nearby Rievaulx Abbey and Kirkham Priory, both English Heritage properties.

Most of Helmsley's surviving stonework defences were raised during the late 12th and 13th centuries, by the crusader Robert de Roos and his descendants. They include a pair of immensely strong 'barbican' entrances and the high, keep-like east tower, unusually D-shaped in plan, which still dominates the town.

But Helmsley is not only a medieval fortress. During the Elizabethan period the Manners family remodeled the castle's chamber block into a luxurious mansion, whose fine plasterwork and paneling still partly survive. The castle's first and last military trial came during the Civil War. Held for King Charles, it endured a three month siege before being starved out in November 1644 by Parliamentarians under Sir Thomas Fairfax, who was seriously wounded in the fighting. Fairfax then dismantled the defences but spared the mansion, subsequently the home of his daughter and her husband, the profligate Duke of Buckingham.

Helmsley Castle has recently undergone a thorough makeover by English Heritage, making it more accessible to a wide range of visitors. This includes a brand-new visitor centre also providing tourist information, an audio tour, and an imaginative hands-on exhibition in the mansion range. Displaying a fascinating array of finds from Civil War cannon balls to early tableware, this explores the social and domestic as well as the military aspects of the fortress.

# **About Mount Grace Priory**

Mount Grace Priory is set amid woodland, below the escarpment of the North York Moors and the Cleveland Way National Trail, the ruins of this 14th-century monastery represent the best preserved 'charterhouse' of the 10 Carthusian monasteries in Britain. A reconstructed monk's cell and herb garden offer visitors a glimpse into the daily lives of the medieval residents. The gardens - remodeled in the early 20th century - are now a haven for wildlife, including the famous 'Priory Stoats'.

## **About Richmond Castle**

Dramatically situated high on a rocky promontory, the castle's formidable keep looks over the River Swale and the rooftops of the market town of Richmond. Originally built by the Normans to control the north, the castle's past as a fortress, barracks and prison is explored in an exciting exhibition, 'Castle, Commerce and Conscience'.

The new Contemporary Heritage Garden is a place of contemplation and offers commanding views of the surrounding area. The castle's keep is also reputed to be the place where the legendary King Arthur sleeps.

# About Rievaulx Abbey

'Everywhere peace, everywhere serenity, and a marvellous freedom from the tumult of the world.' These words, written over eight centuries ago by the monastery's third abbot St Aelred, could describe Rievaulx today. Set in a beautiful and tranquil valley, it is among the most atmospheric and complete of all the ruined abbeys of the north.

Words are not the only link to Rievaulx's medieval monks. Over the past few years, the site has become something of an archaeological treasure, with unexpected discoveries shedding new light on the lives of the abbey's former residents, and the extensive renewal and rebuilding of the abbey church in the Early English Gothic style. Archaeologists continue to study the wider landscape around Rievaulx, revealing the remarkable extent of the abbey's influence and industry: their discoveries are showcased in the site's annual archaeology day in July, and within the on-site museum.

The abbey was founded by St Bernard of Clairvaux, as part of the missionary effort to reform Christianity in western Europe. Just 12 Clairvaux monks came to Rievaulx in 1132. From these modest beginnings grew one of the wealthiest monasteries of medieval England and the first northern Cistercian monastery. Rievaulx also enjoyed the protection of Walter Espec of nearby Helmsley Castle, who provided much of the abbey's land. The monks of nearby Byland Abbey disputed land ownership with Rievaulx, which led to engineering works to divert the course of the River Rye, the boundary between their properties. You can still see traces of the old river and the channels dug by the monks.

A steady stream of monks came to Rievaulx Abbey, attracted by the prestige of Abbot Aelred, author and preacher, who was regarded then and later as a wise and saintly man. Following his death in 1167, the monks of Rievaulx sought canonisation for their former leader, and in the 1220s they rebuilt the east part of their church in a much more elaborate style to house his tomb. Most of this 13th-century 'presbytery' still stands to virtually its full impressive height, a reminder of Rievaulx's original splendour.

Rievaulx was still a vibrant community when Henry VIII dissolved it in 1538. Its new owner, Thomas Manners, first Earl of Rutland, swiftly instigated the systematic destruction of the buildings. But the substantial remains left behind still constitute one of the most eloquent of all monastic sites, free 'from the tumult of the world'.

Don't miss the exciting indoor exhibition, 'The Works of God and Man', which explores the agricultural, industrial, spiritual and construction aspects of Rievaulx's history, employing a variety of lively and interactive displays. There are family-friendly books and activities, and special children's' trails during school holidays.

Byland Abbey and Helmsley Castle are both within reasonable travelling distance: Helmsley Castle can be reached on foot via the Cleveland Way National Trail (approx. 2.5 miles/1.5 hours each way, strong footwear required).

# **About Scarborough Castle**

Scarborough Castle defends a prominent headland between two bays, with sheer drops to the sea and only a narrow landward approach. Long before the castle was built, this natural fortress was favoured by prehistoric settlers - a splendid Bronze Age sword, perhaps deposited here as a sacrifice to the gods, has newly returned for display -and later housed a defended Roman signal station.

Henry II's towering 12th-century keep, dominating the approach, is the centrepiece of fortifications developed over later centuries in response to repeated sieges -notably by rebel barons in 1312, and twice during the Civil War. Though again strengthened with barracks and gun-batteries against Jacobite threats in 1745, the castle failed to defend the harbour against the American sea-raider John Paul Jones in 1779, and was itself damaged by German naval bombardment in 1914. During World War II it played the more covert role of hosting a secret listening post.

Specially constructed viewing platforms now offer wonderful views of the coastline. The site's 3,000-year history is explored in new interactive displays in the restored Master Gunner's House, accompanied by the prehistoric sword and artefacts from each period of Scarborough's past. Less mobile visitors can enjoy a ground-floor touch-screen virtual tour of the displays.

Timelined graphic panels around the castle focus on characters from times gone by, and there are free activity sheets, an audio tour and an investigative story box to help younger visitors visualise and understand the history of the castle.

# About Whitby Abbey

Set high on a headland, Whitby Abbey's gaunt and moving remains have associations as diverse as Victorian jewellery, whaling and Count Dracula. Those who choose to approach the Abbey – up the 199 steps from Whitby town – know the meaning of dedication!

Over the centuries the headland has been an inspiration to all sorts of people, for very different reasons. Anglo Saxon saints and kings are buried on it, medieval monks built their abbey here, the flamboyant Cholmley family came to own it, and two Victorians made it famous worldwide: Bram Stoker with his Dracula, and Frank Meadow Sutcliffe with countless black and white photographs.

That's why the abbey ruin isn't the only remarkable feature in this landscape. In fact, there are three others. The parish church of Saint Mary's, the remains of the Cholmley house within the boundaries of the former abbey, and the ground beneath your feet. Even today, the headland continues to offer up its secrets to historians and archaeologists.
