

Nimlas Sweden acquires EF Rör

Nimlas Sweden continues its growth journey and strengthens its position in Stockholm through the acquisition of EF Rör AB. The acquisition is in line with the Group's growth strategy 5-50-500, which aims to reach SEK 5 billion in revenue, add 50 new companies, and achieve SEK 500 million in profit.
