Holy Trinity, Goodramgate, York, YO1 7LF

12pm-4pm (Sun-Mon), 10am-4pm (Tues-Sat)

### **FREE**

Holy Trinity, Goodramgate, is one of York's hidden treasure. Located in the heart of the city centre but secluded in a leafy churchyard since the 11<sup>th</sup> century, with stained glass from the 15<sup>th</sup> century, some of the country's earliest box pews and monuments to the famous (and the not-so) can be discovered within its walls.

Their team of expert volunteer guides are on hand to tell this church's fascinating stories and answer questions.

St Lawrence's Tower, off Lawrence Street, York, YO10 3BN

Visit St. Lawrence's tower with its fine decorative twelfth-century doorway. The medieval church no longer exists, having been demolished in the 1800s to make way for the new church. But the tower stands in the churchyard and retains the original north door. Characteristic of many Norman doorways, the sculpture includes Romanesque patterns and mythical beasts.

St Mary, Goathland, N Yorks YO22 5AN

#### **FREE**

Discover 'Crosses and Mice: the Medieval Heritage of a Small Moorland Church', a self-guiding tour and small exhibitions on the history of the church and medieval mice!

Explore the church's medieval heritage, including its early altar slab carved with crosses. There is a church trail for kids too, and a mouse-hunting game to celebrate the work of famed carver Robert 'Mouseman' Thompson!

### **Saturday 1st August**

St Nicholas, Hornsea, East Riding, HU18 1AB

10am - 4pm

### **FREE**

A special Medieval Day at a church whose interior was described by Pevsner as 'uncommonly impressive'. There is lots to see including an amazing collection of medieval tombs, windows of Saints George, Paulinus, and Nicholas, as well as an early medieval font.

There are also introductions to medieval life available throughout the day and a chance to see the crypt, home of 'Nanny Cankerneedle'.

Artwork, refreshments, stalls, displays and activities for all ages in the church, hall and grounds. Compline at 3.30pm.

### FREE

Follow a trail that links the eight churches of the parish of West Buckrose, an area steeped in Christian heritage, from the early Middle Ages, through Methodism and Victorian revival, to the present day.

St Wilfrid, Monk Fryston, W Yorks, LS25 5DY

#### **FREE**

Thomas of Bayeux, the first Norman Archbishop of York, gave land to the monks of Selby Abbey at Fryston: the eleventh-century tower of this fascinating church dates from around this time. The church will be open to visitors for local history displays and talks, and more besides.

With a history walk on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> August at 6pm, departing from the church, followed at 8pm by a lecture from Professor Mark Ormrod (University of York), a medieval concert by musician Peter Bull on Friday 7<sup>th</sup> August from 7:30pm and an archaeological dig!

Also on hand will be a knight of the thirteenth century, who will chat to visitors about life on crusade, inspired by a Purbeck marble effigy reputed to show a Templar from the nearby preceptory at Faxfleet.

Come and discover more about the archaeology of our church with guided tours, and see our new medieval veggie and herb plot, devised by the Let's Go playgroup! Dr David Petts, Lecturer in Archaeology at Durham University will also be on hand to answer your questions.

JORVIK Medieval Festival Church Explorers listings: final draft 21.05.15

This glorious twelfth-century church is without a doubt one of the most stunning and well preserved examples of Romanesque building in the whole of the British Isles.

Come along for a medieval afternoon with guided tours, history tales, trails, refreshments and a display of artwork by local children.

St Mary and St Alkelda, Middleham, N Yorks, DL8 4PQ

Medieval Fair 10am – 4pm

#### **FREE**

The future Richard III was a patron of this church, which now houses a wealth of medieval features, including an elaborate wooden font canopy and the grave cover of one of the last abbots of Jervaulx.

The medieval fair will be followed by a 'Medieval Middleham' lecture at 5.30pm, and a presentation on 'Iconography in the Medieval World' by Dr Barbara Morden at 6.30pm.

St Martin on the Hill, Scarborough, YO11 2BT

Explore the Victorian view of the medieval through guided walks to explore the church's magnificent collection of newly restored pre-raphaelite glass, together with other treasures by William Morris.

At 2pm hear from David and Wendy Johnson of the Richard III Society about Richard III's connections with Sheriff Hutton, and from Vanessa Roe of the Plantagenet Alliance about her family connections with Richard III and the Thwengs of Cornborough, ancestors of Joan Thweng of Barley Hall.

### St Mary, Church Fenton, N Yorks, LS23 6DR

#### 10.30am - 4pm

Guided tours of this fascinating building by villagers from the 15th century and a costumed 'service' in Latin on Saturday afternoon will highlight the deep medieval heritage of this church.

Join in as local craftspeople teach skills used at the time of the Battle of Towton. Visitors will also be able to consult a medieval 'doctor' and buy herbs from his stall and an investigation into an effigy of a mysterious fourteenth-century lady will delight budding historical detectives!

There will be cream teas available on the adjacent vicarage lawn, as well as cake and craft stalls, and a full range of children's activities.

### St Mary, Thirsk, YO7 1PR

#### 10am - 4pm

Come to a church described by Pevsner as 'without question...the most spectacular Perpendicular church in the North Riding'.

As a part of the JORVIK Medieval Festival, the church presents *Wood you believe it?* - an exhibition on all aspects of wood carving, from the medieval to the present, with modern examples by local carvers on display, plus the church's own medieval woodwork.

Please note: on Sundays 23rd and 30<sup>th</sup> August times of opening will be 12noon to 4pm (after the service). On Mondays 24th and 31st August refreshments will be served in St Mary's Crypt.

# 10.30am - 4pm, Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> August; 1pm - 4pm, Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> August

### St Hilda, Ampleforth, N Yorks, YO62 4DU

#### 10:30am

This humble church, whose oldest features date back to the twelfth century, is full of medieval interest, not least in its strange fourteenth-century effigy of a man with a woman peeping over his shoulder.

Come along and try a range of medieval crafts, including making corn dollies and trying your hand at being a medieval scribe. There will also be a guiz available to test your skills as a medieval detective.

### 10am - 5pm, Wednesday 26th August

### Selby Abbey, Selby, YO8 4PU

A fun medieval day in the splendid surroundings of Selby Abbey, home to a community of Benedictine monks from the reign of William the Conqueror until the Dissolution of the Monasteries.

Explore displays that tell the story of some of the abbots of Selby, and enjoy a range of family-friendly activities and games, together with drama and music to bring the history of the abbey to life.

### 11am - 3pm, Saturday 29 August

### St Mary Bishophill Junior, York, YO1 6EN

An opportunity to visit the tenth-century St Mary Bishophill Junior, York's oldest working parish church.

Discover informative display of medieval information, and take part in a curator clinic with York Museums Trust historians: a rare chance to see, examine and discuss selected specimens from their own Bishophill Hoard medieval collection!
